A Guide to Addressing Retention Challenges

Higher education institutions are facing lower completion rates, making graduate student retention strategies increasingly essential. Common challenges for graduate students include lack of access to student resources, mental health hardships, financial obstacles, school-life balance issues, workforce uncertainty, and academic stress.

An effective student retention strategy begins with a comprehensive understanding of the challenges students face and the resources available to them. We've put together the following list of questions to help you clarify what might be at the root of your university's specific challenges and how to explore solutions through a proactive and data-driven lens.

1. Assessing Student Support Services

How would you rate the current level and variety of student support services in your institution? Are these services accessible to students of all modalities (e.g. online and/or on-campus)?

2. Balancing School-Life

How well does your institution help prepare students to integrate school, and possibly field placement, into their current life commitments?

3. Addressing Mental Health Issues

What strategies does your institution have in place to address the mental health difficulties faced by graduate students? Are these strategies proactive?

4. Managing Financial Obstacles

Are there financial support systems or resources available for students who may be struggling financially? Can students access these in multiple formats (e.g. in-person and/or online)?

5. Predictive Analysis

Have you considered the use of predictive analysis to identify at-risk students and intervene before they drop out?

6. Workforce Uncertainty

How is your institution preparing graduate students for workforce uncertainty, especially in the current economic climate?

7. Feedback Mechanism

How often does your institution gather feedback from students and take action across departments based on this data?
